The Summit will commence with a live conversation with directors/producers Amanda McBaine and Jesse Moss of Apple TV+'s *Girls State*, moderated by *Variety*'s Senior Artisans Editor Jazz Tangcay. The nonfiction program follows young female leaders — from different backgrounds across Missouri — as they navigate an immersive experiment to build a government from the ground up.

Then, "Climate Storytelling 101: It's Getting Hot In Here!", presented by NRDC's Rewrite the Future, will offer practical advice for creators interested in telling stories about a climate-altered world featuring a live panel discussion with Daniel Hinerfeld, co-founder and director, NRDC's Rewrite the Future, Meredith Milton, creative director, NRDC's Rewrite the Future and producer Dorothy Fortenberry (*The Handmaid's Tale, Extrapolations*).

The online event continues with an "Ask Me Anything" session with Jamila Hunter, President of Macro Television Studios; as well as "A Showrunner's Path" with *Dr. Death*'s showrunner Ashley Michel Hoban.

The Summit will close with "Script to Screen: *Lessons in Chemistry*," a panel discussion with cast members and producers from the hit series moderated by

Mara Webster, Co-Founder, Head of Programming and Host at In Creative Company.
